IMAGE RELEASE CONSENT

At Whistler Waldorf School we take your privacy and that of your child's very seriously and do our best to be respectful with the use of imagery captured during the school day and at events. It is understood that Whistler Waldorf School may collect, store, use and share photographs, videos, images and/or names of students on the school, website(s) and in a variety of publications for education related purposes, such as recognizing and encouraging student achievement, building the school community, and informing others about school programs and activities. For example, student names and/or images may be used or shared in school communications, such as newsletters, brochures, and reports in limited or public circulation; the school website, social media sites (e.g. Facebook), and online video (e.g. YouTube), with reviewed public access.

Likewise, Whistler Waldorf School may photograph and video your child, and otherwise capture his/her image, and/or to make recordings of his/her voice using Zoom, Planbook or Microsoft Teams for the purpose of facilitating distance learning.

Families are asked to provide image release consent annually as a part of their child's Re-enrolment Agreement or upon initial enrolment through the completion of the Enrolment Agreement. This consent may be withdrawn at any time in writing, but withdrawal of consent does not require the Whistler Waldorf School to take any steps to withdraw from publication any previously published material.

If you have a concern with the above understanding you are expected to register an objection by emailing Communications to fill out a no image release package, as well as discussing with your child ways they can avoid being included in possible photo capturing circumstances during school events.
