Payments & Financial Obligations

PLAN A - FULL payment due by May 5, 2022 (Payments made by credit card subject to a non-refundable 3% convenience fee)

PLAN B - TWO payments due by May 5, 2022 & October 5, 2022 (Payments made by credit card subject to a non-refundable 3% convenience fee)

PLAN C - TWELVE payments due May 5, 2022 - April 5, 2023 and made via pre-authorized debit

Late Fee

A late fee of \$500 will be applied at the time of a current student's re-enrollment if such re-enrollment takes place after March 18, 2022. If re-enrollment requirements are not met by the March 18, 2022 deadline, the School cannot guarantee a space will be available for the 2022-23 year. Late fees are non-refundable.

Tuition Deposit

A tuition deposit of \$300 (\$750 for classes at maximum capacity) will be due March 21, 2022. This deposit is directly applied to the May 5, 2022 tuition payment and is non-refundable.

School Supply Fees

School Supply Fees are collected by the school on behalf of the Parent Council and are payable as per the tuition payment plan selected in the 2022-2023 Enrollment Agreement. School Supply Fees are non-refundable.

Trip Fees

Trip Fees are payable as per the tuition payment plan selected in the 2022-2023 Enrollment Agreement. Trip Fees are non-refundable.

Sibling Discount

A sibling discount is available for students in K-12 who share at least one parent in common (i.e. cousins are not eligible for the sibling discount). The oldest sibling will owe the 1st Student Tuition Rate at that student's grade level, the second oldest and subsequent siblings in birth order will receive a 25% discount and owe the 2nd Student Tuition Rate at that student's grade level. Little Cedars and Early Years Centre Spring Creek students are not eligible for sibling discounts or considered to be siblings in calculations of sibling discounts.

Additional Fees

There may be additional fees required from time to time, such as fees for musical instruments, additional school field trips, special projects, etc.

International & Non-Resident Students

The school does not receive provincial government funding for international students or students whose legal guardians are non-residents. Because of this, international and non-resident tuition fees reflect the cost of providing a full educational program to these non-funded students. International and Non-Resident students must also pay the School Supply Fees and Trip Fees applicable to that student's grade level.

NSF Charges

A charge of \$40 will be applied for pre-authorized debits that are returned to the School by your financial institution because of insufficient funds. The family must make immediate arrangement for replacement of refused payments.

Arrears Balance

In order for a student to remain enrolled at the School, payments must be received in accordance with the payment method selected in the 2022-23 Enrollment Agreement. An interest and administrative charge of 2% per month (24% per annum) will be applied to any unpaid balance 30 days after the due date.

Loss of Student Funding

A portion of the School's costs of providing education to each student are paid for by the provincial government in the form of per student funding. Except in extenuating circumstances, in the event that a student's poor attendance results in the School not receiving all or a portion of this provincial government funding for that student, the student's parents will be responsible for paying to the School the amount of the provincial government funding lost.

Tuition Adjustment Program

We are committed to ensuring that no family for whom the school is a good fit will be turned away due to financial hardship. If it is truly a hardship for a family to pay the full fees, a Tuition Adjustment Program may be available where an adjustment is made to the tuition owed by the family. School Supply Fees and Trip Fees are not adjusted. The Tuition Adjustment Program is not available for Licensed Group Childcare programs. Tuition adjustment is available through a confidential 3rd party application process.

Withdrawal & Tuition Refund Policy

It is essential that the School's annual income from tuition and fees be assured for it to honour its annual commitments to staff and other support partners. The withdrawal or dismissal of a student does not reduce overall operating expenses; therefore, parents are asked to make a financial commitment for the full year.

If a student is withdrawn from the School for any reason (excluding major illness), the Admissions Manager must be notified in writing, and the notice must state the reason for the withdrawal and the final date the student will be attending the School. The following terms for the refund of pre-paid tuition and restrictions on the cancellation of unpaid fee obligations are defined below. Incidental fees including application, tuition deposit, school supply, & trip fees are non-refundable. No tuition refunds will be given after April 1 for that academic year.

Tuition refunds

The refund of tuition for students on financial payment Plan A (full payment) or Plan B (two payments) will be calculated from the month in which the student withdraws based on a May-April (12-month) payment cycle. Accounts will be reconciled as per the examples below.

- a. If a student withdraws in August four months' tuition will be retained and 8/12 refunded. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable
- b. If a student withdraws in October six month's tuition will be charged and 6/12 refunded. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable.

No tuition refunds will be granted to students on financial payment Plan C (12 monthly payments).

- a. If a student withdraws in August four months' tuition will be retained and no further payments taken. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable.
- b. If a student withdraws in October six months' tuition will be retained and no further payments taken. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable.

If a student withdraws during the 12-week provisional period, tuition will be refunded at pro-rated amount based on number of months in attendance. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable.

Completion of the Whistler Waldorf School Enrolment Agreement Notice of Appeal will be requested for withdrawals due to major illness. Requests must be supported by a written medical opinion from a physician in a form reasonably acceptable to the School in its sole discretion. Non-refundable fees remain non-refundable.
